Monday May 13, 2024

**PRESENT:** Rev. Tiff Bates, Krista Kim, Bruce Morris, Tracy Tronnes, Kathleen Matson, Jill Sanderson, Mary Lou Behring and Linda Cutting.

Krista called the meeting to order and Tiff led us in prayer. The April minutes were reviewed. Jill made a motion to approve the minutes as written. Tracy seconded it. Motion carried.

CONGREGATIONAL TIME: Linda Cutting was in attendance to share the progress that has been made cleaning out and going through old files and documents from the office. Lots of things are waiting for a shredding day and a few other things still need to be checked out. Margret Hawkins and Kathleen have also been helping with the process. Kathleen will reach out to the conference regarding certain records that we need to maintain.

MINISTER'S REPORT: Tiff expressed that he and Lynn enjoyed a very nice vacation. Membership Sunday was a highlight with seven people joining the church! Sunday May 19th we will be celebrating the end of the Sunday school year, the blessing of the new Rainbow Spirit Library and Baccalaureate. We will also collect monies for "Strengthen the Church offering the 19th and the 26th. Summer Worship: Tiff will be taking off a Sunday a month. We will have special speakers and events on those Sundays. The film "Cotton Patch Gospel "is a movie Tiff would like the church family to see. Sunday June 23rd has been decided on. There will be 2 showings. A matinee at 3:00p.m. and a 6:30 p.m.

COMMUNICATION/OFFICE ADMINISTRATOR: Kathleen stated that she is busy updating the membership lists. Hard copies will be made available to those that would like one. Name tags have been made for all the new members and anyone that would like an updated one, let Kathleen know. A Worship calendar is being created. CHRISTIAN EDUCATION: Sunday will be the last day of Sunday school for the Summer. We will be dedicating our new "Rainbow Spirit Library" this week. Children can check out books and take them home. If they read 7 this summer they will get a prize. Jill is working on a document for family Sundays. The first one will be June 9th and is called "Experiencing God in everyday life". There will be a summer book study co-chaired by Connie Tronnes and Jill. The book is called "Listening Path" to be held on Tuesday evenings from 6:00-7:00, starting on June 4th. The community is welcome!

**TRUSTEES:** No quorum. The new doors that were ordered have arrived and are waiting on installation. **OLD BUSINESS:** The new printer is up and running in fellowship hall! Kathleen will check on a key for the marquee as you enter fellowship hall.

**NEW BUSINESS:** Prayer slips will be available in the sanctuary to give to Tiff before worship. Kathleen will come up with a document stating all the procedures for opening and closing the church on Sunday mornings. Krista and Jill are interested in taking some leadership courses through the conference. There are many courses available including things like family programming and lay ministry. This will be a huge asset for our church as we move forward.

Dear church friends,

Our search process has yielded only one additional candidate for the position of settled pastor. This individual decided to retire. Though we are still advertising our church profile for potential candidates, we have realized more than ever that the life of small churches is indeed changing and requires new ideas. We have learned that candidates for small churches do not necessarily want to lead worship every Sunday and some of them are drawn to churches who have hired staff to coordinate and lead family and mission/service programs. Having consistency in a position such as this helps sustain church life between interim ministers as well as throughout the eventual transition to a settled pastor.

It is our good fortune that Jill Sanderson has agreed to work as our Director of Ministry Education (10 hours weekly) in a paid staff position. It is our double good fortune that Rev. Tiff Bates will stay on with us as pastor while reducing his monthly workload by one week per month. This adjustment in staffing (reducing Tiff's hours and hiring Jill) does not impact our budget. It DOES mean that once a month our worship will be led by guest clergy/speakers and/or be enhanced via family and mission-based programming. Pastor Tiff will continue to be our interim minister (taking one week off each month) and will be available for pastoral care as needed. Kathleen will remain in her administrative position and will continue to work to promote our mission and vision within our community.

Jill and I are currently attending a monthly class of "discernment" (via the Wi UCC conference). Kathleen and Jill are already planning programming for fall - all of these new ideas and initiatives continue to be supported and encouraged both by Tiff and council members. We hope you'll join us as we continue to listen for the holy spirit and celebrate God's presence amidst our church family and the Edgerton community.

A reminder of our mission statement: To strengthen our Christian values and lives for all people through faith, fellowship and youth.
